Employees Returning to Work with Restrictions

A mask must be worn at all times (N95 or Surgical mask)

N95 masks are required for staff providing prolonged periods of care or those undergoing aerosolizing procedures and therapies for COVID/PUI patients:

- * Prolonged Period of Care (greater than 10 minutes or multiple encounters per shift)
- * Aerosolizing procedures and therapies:
 - Nasopharyngeal and oropharyngeal swabbing
 - Open suctioning of airways, including tracheostomies, nose and mouth
 - Noninvasive ventilation modes such as CPAP/BiPAP
 - High flow nasal oxygen (via a HFNO system)
 - Nebulizer treatments
 - Intubation and Extubation
 - Bronchoscopy
 - Upper endoscopy in a non-intubated patient
 - Surgical Procedures involving the airway

Employee returning to work with restrictions

Follow Return to Work guidelines given by Employee Health

Upon returning to work and entering Hospital, wear surgical mask provided by **Employee Health**

If mask cover is soiled - discard

Upon exiting room - If using mask for extended use (room to room) do not remove N95 mask and mask cover unless soiled

> **Get another** mask cover from unit/floor

for laundry.

Immediately

Report

to unit

If N95 is soiled discard in biohazard container outside room. Immediately perform hand hygiene.

> **Get another** N95 from charge nurse

room, put on N95 mask with a mask cover (keep N95 for entire shift unless soiled)

Upon entering

Upon exiting room - when keeping N95 mask for reuse -

- Remove mask cover and discard in purple bag for laundry
- Perform hand hygiene
- Store N95 mask in clean brown bag with name and date (written on bag, NOT on front of N95 mask)
- Put on surgical mask
